Subject: KMOX Radio Takes Six Edward R. Murrow Regional Awards

The Radio-Television News Directors Association announced that KMOX Radio has received six 2006 Edward R. Murrow Regional Awards. This is the highest number of awards won by a radio or television station in St. Louis.

In addition to "Overall Excellence," the station won "Spot News Coverage" for the complete coverage of the severe storms in July 2006 which left hundreds of thousands of St. Louis residents without power. Series Reporter, Megan Lynch, won for "Investigative Reporting" with "Precious Cargo on the Big Yellow Bus" which examined the school bus safety debate in Jefferson City. Lynch also won "News Series" for "The Big Differential" which looked at the safety issues between commuters and truck drivers. "Use of Sound" was awarded to Creative Service Director Dave King for his special report "KMOX Remembers 9/11," which commemorated the fifth anniversary of the September 11th attacks. And, the station won "Newscast" for the 8:00am news.

"I am proud that the KMOX news team has received such accolades from their peers," stated Dave Ervin, Vice President and General Manager of KMOX. "Our showing in the RTNDA Regional Murrow Awards underscores the dedication of everyone to provide a quality product that continues its unprecedented ratings domination."

Murrow's pursuit for excellence in journalism embodies the spirit of the awards that carry his name. Murrow award recipients demonstrate the spirit of excellence that Edward R.
